

Piketberg Museum

Piketberg Museum came into being thanks to its benefactor, the late Mr A J Liebenberg, who bequeathed his house and some of its contents to Piketberg Municipality in 1983. During 1998 the museum relocated to a house at 10 Church Street where a variety of household items are displayed and conserved. For the historian this is an archive where more can be learnt about the origins of Piketberg and its development, enhanced by a variety of photographs. Of particular interest is the room housing the Anglo Boer War exhibition, displaying events that took place in and around Piketberg.

Synagogue

The Synagogue is an extension of the house museum. The building was erected in 1925 by Lodewyk Ando Simon, a Hungarian Jew. The building was erected for Jewish families who fled as refugees and settled in the area from around 1880.

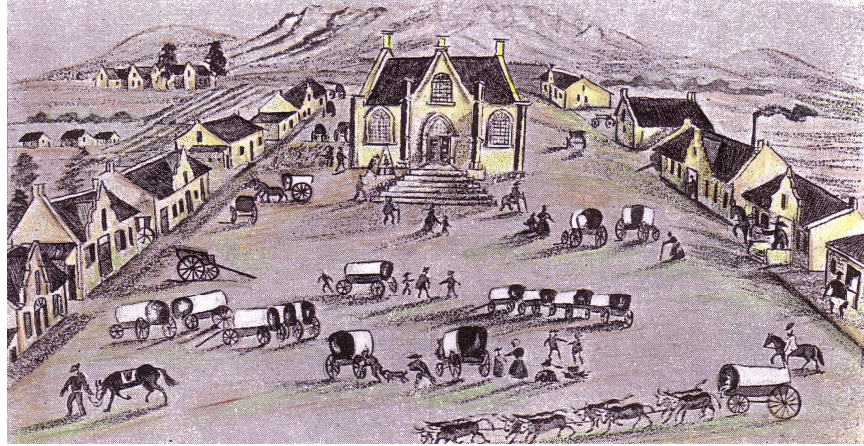
New exhibitions on sites in conjunction with the Cape Museum Services relating to the local history with items for educational programmes can be viewed shortly.
