











CHANGE IN POPULATION WEST COAST DISTRICT 2006 - 2011




GVA GROWTH CHANGE WEST COAST DISTRICT 1996-2013





WC PSDF Municipal Financial Sustainability Specialist Study (2013)




Current sources of capital finance










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CHANGE DETECTION: DENSITY














Percentage distribution of youth by province, 2009 and 2014




Percentage growth of youth population among population groups, 2009 and 2014




Youth In- and out-migration rates by province, 2011






Inactivity Rate


Unemployed by age


Unemployed : level of education






LEARNER TEACHER RATIO



The learner-teacher ratio within Bergrivier deteriorated between 2012 and 2013, improved in 2014, and deteriorated drastically to 33.4 in 2015. According to the national department of education the number of learners per teacher was 30.3 in 2010. Factors influencing the learner teacher ratio is the ability of schools to employ more educators when needed and the ability to collect school fees.




- DROP OUT RATE: 31,7% from Gr 10 in 2014 to Gr 12 in 2016

- Bergrivier has the second lowest percentage of no-fee schools in the district, as research indicates that learners often drop-out of school due to lack of money.





POVERTY HEADCOUNT AND INTENSITY

The higher poverty headcount show that the number of poor people within the Bergrivier municipal area has increased from 1.0 per cent of Bergrivier's population in 2011 to 1.6 per cent of the population in 2016. The increasing poverty headcount is a concern as it may strain municipal financial resources.

The Non-Financial Census of Municipalities released by Statistics South Africa in 2016 indicates increases or decreases of indigent households per municipal area between 2014 and 2015.





The majority of households in Bergrivier area reside in formal dwellings (91.6 per cent) whilst 8.4 per cent of the households reside either in informal, traditional and other dwellings in 2016. Access to formal dwellings increased by 15.1 per cent from 15 193 households in 2011 to 17 487 households in 2016 and by 18.7 per cent across the District over the same period.

- The murder rate has remained static at 12 cases from 2015 to 2016 in Bergrivier.
- West Coast decreased by 3.6 per cent from 28 to 27 over the same period.
- The murder rate in Bergrivier remains well below that of the District, which average 27 cases per 100 000 people.

Definition: Sexual offences includes rape (updated to the new definition of rape to provide for the inclusion of male rape), sex work, pornography, public indecency and human trafficking.

In 2016, there were 70 sexual crimes (or 15.6 per cent less) recorded in Bergrivier compared with 83 the previous year whilst it declined by 8.2 per cent from 122 in 2015 to 112 in 2016 across the West Coast District. Bergrivier's sexual related crime rate remains below that of the District.

Drug related crimes within the Bergrivier increased by 12.4 per cent from 1 298 in 2015 to 1 459 cases in 2016. The incidence of drug related crimes increased at a much slower rate across the West Coast District; increasing by 1.4 per cent from 1 093 to 1 108 in 2016.

Drug-related crimes nevertheless remains a major concern throughout the West Coast District; especially in the Bergrivier area, which experience a substantially higher rate of drug related crimes than the District.

The number of cases of driving under the influence of alcohol or drugs in Bergrivier has increased sharply from 2015 to 2016. In 2016, 106 incidences were dealt with in the Bergrivier area compared with 86 in 2015. However, the cases of driving under the influence of drugs and alcohol in West Coast District dropped by 5.1 per cent from 99 in 2015 to 94 in 2016. This resulted in a higher incidence of driving under the influence of drugs and alcohol in Bergrivier compared to West Coast District in 2016.





Given its regular occurrence and the psychological impact on victims, residential burglaries are an obstinate concern in South Africa. The cases of residential burglaries within Bergrivier area increased by 9.3 per cent from 313 in 2015 to 342 in 2016. The West Coast District is no exception, with residential burglaries increasing by 9.0 per cent from 555 in 2015 to 605 in 2016. Bergrivier's residential burglaries related crime rate remains below the District average.







Total Planned Infrastructure Investment in the WC MTEF (2015/16 to 2017/18) per Local Municipality




